Specificity:

The antibody reacts with CD16 antigen that functions as a low affinity receptor for aggregated IgG (FcgammaRIII antigen). CD16 antigen exists in two different isoforms: CD16a is a transmembrane form (50-65 kDa) expressed on NK cells, monocytes and macrophages; CD16b is a GPI-anchored form (48 kDa) mainly expressed on neutrophils.

Isotype subclass: Mouse IgG1

Form:

The purified antibody is conjugated with Fluorescein isothiocyanate (FITC) under optimum conditions. The reagent is free of unconjugated FITC and adjusted for direct use. No reconstitution is necessary.

Physical state: Liquid

Buffer/Additives/Preservative:

PBS containing BSA and 15 mM sodium azide (pH 7.4)

Expiration date:

The reagent is stable until the expiry date stated on the vial label

Storage conditions:

Store at 4 °C. Do not freeze. Avoid prolonged exposure to light
